

Cystoscopy Aftercare

You have just had a procedure called a Cystoscopy, which is a telescope into your urethra (the tube through which urine (wee) leaves the body) into your bladder (where your wee is held inside your body).

A doctor or a nurse will explain what they have found to you. If you do not understand anything, please ask before you go home.

Another appointment will be made for you if it is needed.

Your doctor or nurse will talk to you about the importance of drinking more over the next 24 hours to flush your system through.

What you can expect when you get home

You will probably get a feeling of burning and may bleed for the first few days when you pass urine (wee).

- **develop a fever (high temperature)**
- **have severe pain on passing urine**
